Advice from netINS on Phishing Emails

Phishing emails — fraudulent messages designed to trick you into revealing sensitive information — are probably sent to you daily. Many are obviously phishing, but some look much more legit. If you question the legitimacy of an email or recognize that it needs to be reported, send it to abuse@netins.net. Never respond with any personal information like your username, password, Social Security number or bank account information. Legitimate companies, including netINS, will never ask for this information via email.

If you respond to such an email and realize it was the wrong thing to do, call Tech Support at 800-205-1110 immediately. Tech Support will help you change your password to stop the sender of the email from using your information. If a questionable email was found in your spam folder, the email has already been reported and email administration took action to move the message to spam for any customers who received it.

When Ping is Too High, It Can Be "Game Over"

Are there online gamers in your household? If so, it's important to understand the internet's role in gaming. While quick thinking and even quicker thumbs are a must, sometimes it's the internet connection that can make or break a performance. Upload speed is particularly valuable in gaming, since it impacts ping.

What's ping, you ask? It's the reaction time required for information to go to the server and back. You can also think of ping as the number of milliseconds (ms) it takes for your computer or game console to respond to a request by another computer.

Ping requirements vary from game to game, and serious gamers will want to strive for the lowest possible ping that the environment can provide. Here are general guidelines:

Less than 20ms: This is optimal for gaming. Visuals are crisp and actions are quick. You should not experience any lags or glitches during gameplay. *763-4585*

20ms - 50ms: This is the most common range for gamers. You should still experience smooth and responsive gameplay.

50ms - 100ms: This is the average range for gamers who are connecting to international servers. You may experience occasional lag depending on the game and your settings.

100ms - 300ms: Lags and delays are common but do not completely disrupt gameplay. You're likely to encounter dips in performance and in-game responsiveness.

More than 300ms: There is noticeable lag, long delays in response, inconsistent movements, and lost shots. Ping in this range will likely be more frustrating than rewarding.

Watch Out for Computer Vision Syndrome

As a child, you may have been warned by your parents not to sit too close to the TV because it would hurt your eyes. These days, we're spending more time than ever in front of a screen, since computers, smartphones, and tablets have been added to the mix.

Continuous or prolonged use of technology can lead to computer vision syndrome, which may include eye strain, headaches, fatigue, burning or tired eyes, loss of focus, blurred vision, double vision, or head/neck pain. *767-2571*

The American Optometric Association (AOA) recommends implementing a 20-20-20 rule with technology—take a 20-second break every 20 minutes and look at something 20 feet away. Staring off into the distance helps the eyes from locking into a close-up position. The AOA also advises people to do the following:

- Keep the computer screen 15 to 20 degrees below eye level (about 4 or 5 inches as measured from the center of the screen) and 20 to 28 inches away from the eyes.
- Avoid glare. If needed, turn the desk or computer to prevent glare on the screen.
- Reduce the amount of light in the room to match the computer screen.
- Blink frequently. It will keep the front surface of the eye moist.

Of course, taking steps to prevent computer vision syndrome is just one aspect of managing your eye health. Another is to regularly schedule a comprehensive eye exam, which can detect eye diseases and conditions in their early stages. If it's been awhile since you or other members of your family have had an eye exam, be sure to make an appointment soon.

New FCC Rules Help to Block Spoofed Robocalls

Americans receive millions of unwanted phone calls daily. These include spoofed robocalls, when a caller transmits misleading or inaccurate caller ID information to deceive recipients into thinking the call is from someone they know or can trust.

These calls are not simply annoying. Robocall schemes take approximately \$10 billion from consumers in scams each year. They're also reducing consumer confidence — by some estimates, more than half of all calls are not being answered. 769-2468

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) now requires all originating and terminating voice service providers to implement caller ID authentication using STIR/SHAKEN technological standards in the Internet Protocol (IP) portions of their networks. This requirement became effective on June 30, 2021. STIR/SHAKEN stands for Secure Telephone Identity Revisited (STIR) and Signature-based Handling of Asserted Information Using toKENs (SHAKEN). It requires carriers to "sign" calls they originate, preventing spoofed caller ID data and guaranteeing that the caller ID information that appears on phones is trustworthy.
